## Guest Speaker:

**1. Approval of the Agenda**

June Creelman welcomed everyone to the meeting. The Glebe Community Association has over 4000 members and the AGM provides an opportunity for the Board to report to residents on its activities.

### **3. Guest Speaker**

Anne Scotten, Past President and Board member for 20 years, introduced the evening's guest speaker: Judith Maxwell, a Glebe resident and Past President and Research Fellow, Canadian Policy Research Networks. Mrs. Maxwell spoke about the challenges facing communities like the Glebe and how many of these issues are likely to be symptoms of long term trends in this region and beyond. ### **4. President's Report**

June Creelman spoke to the GCA Report on 2005-06 Activities (will be posted on The Glebe on Line). In addition, she reported that the GCA is working on All Candidates' Meetings for the fall municipal election. Scotten Hall has already been booked for a Councillors' meeting and the GCA is working with other community associations on a mayoral meeting, likely to be held at St. Paul's University. Designation of the Heritage Conservation District is within the bureaucratic process but looks like it will happen. A Farmers' Market will be held Sundays at Lansdowne Park starting July 2 until the fall (no market during Exhibition weekends). A new committee to deal with the graffiti in the Glebe is being chaired by Liam McGahern, on behalf of the Glebe Business Group, and Colleen Leighton, on behalf of the GCA. There are many committees within the GCA and all welcome new members; the Traffic Committee is separately seeking members at this point. As well, the Great Glebe Garage Sale is a huge event and the GCA coordinator could use some extra hands. The Walk Til you Shop event was led by Chris Bradshaw. Unfortunately, Chris will be moving to a new community so if this event is to continue, someone will have to step forward to head it up.

Councillor Doucet, the Glebe Business Group and GCA membership expressed their appreciation to June for the wonderful job she has done over the past three years as President of the GCA.

### **5. Councillor's Report**

Councillor Doucet focused on five issues. He is proposing that Property Tax Assessment be based on a combination of most recent property sale price and a cost of living increase. The Farmers' Market at Lansdowne will be good for the neighbourhood and will feature local goods. The reconstruction of Fifth Avenue and Craig Street is starting. Sidewalks will be wider and roads narrower which will hopefully slow traffic on Craig. Planning for a light rail transit proposal is moving forward and the Great Glebe Garage Sale has become a very big event and the City's events central unit needs to be involved.

### **6. Motion to Amend the Glebe Traffic Plan**

Work to create the Glebe Traffic Plan was started about 9 years ago and was completed in 2002. Some phased-in measures to phase in controls of cut-through traffic from Bronson are being proposed. As the Glebe traffic plan came to the membership at large for approval, the Board

thought that this amendment should also be presented to the full GCA membership. Some short-term aspects of the plan might be implemented as early as this summer.

*Short Term:* Allow right turns from north-bound Bronson on all Glebe streets (status quo) but during the morning peak rush hour (7 a.m. to 9 a.m., Monday to Friday) only, implement the following restrictions:

- Prohibit right-hand turns from Torrington Place onto Queen Elizabeth Driveway during the morning peak
- Prohibit right-hand turns from Broadway Avenue onto Queen Elizabeth Driveway during the morning peak.
- Prohibit left-hand turns on the accessway on the Queen Elizabeth Driveway half way between Torrington and Broadway to prevent U-turns during the morning peak.
- Prohibit left turns from Northbound Bronson Avenue onto Madawaska during the morning peak.

*Medium Term:*

- City will monitor traffic in the Glebe and if the traffic on Findlay, Broadway, Torrington is displaced to other residential streets, the City will implement measures to mitigate displacement.
- City will conduct a traffic study to evaluate the inclusion of Sunnyside in the morning peak right turn prohibition on Bronson. This is in addition to a study that the City will be undertaking to improve safety conditions on Sunnyside between Bank and Bronson.

*Long Term:*

- Implement right-turn restrictions from northbound Bronson Avenue during the morning peak period (7 a.m. to 9 a.m. Monday to Friday) to all Glebe area streets from Findlay through to Renfrew as per the original recommendation of the Glebe Traffic Plan.
- Implement a right turn restriction from Northbound Bronson Avenue on to Sunnyside or an alternative, more effective traffic measure as recommended in medium term impact study.

Long-term measures would be implemented at the same time that the O-Train is operational in the North-South corridor (i.e. in about 3 years if everything goes well). At that time, the measures implemented as per the "short term solution" would be removed.

Note that bicycles and emergency vehicles will be exempted from turn prohibitions. Signage on Bronson at Findlay for access to the QED would be modified to indicate the above turn restrictions.

MOTION: Guy Giguère moved that these proposed steps to amend the phase in of the Glebe Traffic Plan be approved.

## **8. Report of the Nominating Committee and Election of the 2006-07 Board of Directors for the GCA**

June Creelman thanked some Board members that will be stepping down: Anne Scotton, Diana Tyndale, Brian Mitchell, and Chris Bradshaw.

Doreen Drolet presented the slate of nominees for the 2006/07 Board of Directors on behalf of the Nominating Committee. The Committee reaches out as wide as it can and publishes vacancies in the Glebe Report. If someone wants to become active, they should not hesitate to step forward as nominations can be accepted from the floor. The call for additional nominations was posed three times.
